Low fares leader Jetstar is supporting the Women's Tennis Association (WTA) with the annual China Open kicking off this month. The tournament will also see Chinese tennis queens such as Zheng Jie and Peng Shuai battle it out in the courts.

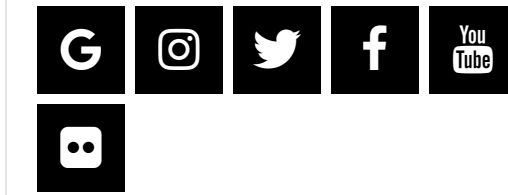
