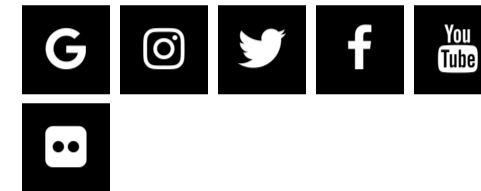
Jetstar Asia currently operates up to 35 flights a week between Singapore and Kuala Lumpur.

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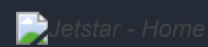


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
